
"We Can Do It Campaign" / "A Can in Each Hand"

ReFRESH Update – Sanctuary & Narthex

Here's a quick summary of what you're viewing:

- •A rounded top design, giving a gentle, uplifting shape to the focal wall
- •A cross-centered frame, reminding us that everything we do is grounded in Christ
- •A subtle accent color behind the cross, creating warmth and focus without distraction
- •Lighting behind or within the frame, illuminating the cross as a symbol of hope
- •Speaker grids modified to fit within the arched shape, honoring the traditional feel many of us cherish

We're currently working closely with Church Interiors to receive the final cost estimates. Once those are available, we will present them to you so you're fully informed of the path ahead.

We want you to know—this isn't change for the sake of change. It's a faithful step in keeping Roberta Church a welcoming, worship-filled place where God's presence is felt, His Word is preached, and His people are equipped to serve.

Just as God refreshes our hearts and renews our spirits, we believe now is the time to refresh the sanctuary and narthex so we can continue to serve our community well—both for those who call Roberta home and for those who will walk through our doors for the very first time.

I was probably in 2nd or 3rd grade then. Each Sunday after Sunday School us kids as well as adults would walk inside the church after the flooring was down. We wanted to see how much had been completed since the week before.

Even as a child; I was so excited that soon we would have a new building to worship God in. After the completion it was so exciting to walk to each floor and smell that smell of new and clean and to think now; how many lives have walked into this church and came out a new person and a new beginning as a Christian.

At that time; I had started taking piano lessons at school and had no piano (my parents could not afford to get me one at the time.) I was given permission from the church leaders to practice there. I would walk from Roberta Mill Community 2 to 3 times a week to the church. Finally, I made it through my first piano recital.

Yes, we can worship God anywhere. Inside, outside in an old building or a new building or no building. Isn't it a great feeling to be able to say" God we present this house; your house, everyone's house to worship you in.

It is our responsibility as Christians to keep God's house clean, updated and a place we proudly welcome others to come and worship (not as a showoff) but the love and honor we all have for God's House. 
Next Men's Fellowship Meeting - May 19th

Missions News: April Update - Camie & Dean Hooks

April Highlights:

- Backpacks of Hope with Esther's Heart: In April, our Missions team partnered with Esther's Heart to pack 220 backpacks filled with food for children in need. These backpacks ensure that kids have meals to take home over the weekend. Thank you to everyone who contributed to this vital mission.
- Soap Sack Ministry: A talented member of our congregation crocheted 100 soap sack crosses, which were donated to Esther's Heart. These soap sacks, each containing a bar of soap, serve as both a washcloth and a symbol of care. They will be distributed to the homeless and to women transitioning out of prison. If you have the skills to crochet or knit and would like to participate in this meaningful project, please reach out to the Missions team.
- **Lifeline Meal Packing:** Our congregation came together to serve at Lifeline, where we packed over 5,000 meals for local food banks. Since 2022, Lifeline has provided over 400,000 meals to our community. Mark your calendars for October 25th, when Roberta Church will join Lifeline's ambitious goal of packing 500,000 meals.
- Harrisburg Crisis Assistance Ministry Food Pantry: In April, we focused on supporting the Harrisburg Crisis Assistance Ministry Food Pantry by collecting peanut butter and jelly. Thanks to your generosity, we were able to make a significant contribution to families in need.



May Mission Focus:

• Wings of Eagles Ranch: This month, we are collecting bottled water and Gatorade for Wings of Eagles Ranch to support their summer camps. These camps serve children with special needs and their typically developing peers, providing a nurturing environment for growth and fun.
