Church family,

There's something hopeful about turning the calendar to January. A new year doesn't erase the challenges we carry, but it does remind us that God is still at work — still renewing, still restoring, still calling us forward.

As we step into this new year together, I want to offer a simple truth to hold onto: **faith was never meant to be passive**. Faith is alive. Faith moves. Faith shows up in real life — in how we love, serve, forgive, and trust God, day by day. That conviction is shaping our focus for the year ahead: **Faith in Motion**.

Now, let me be clear — this isn't about doing more for the sake of being busy. It's not about pressure, performance, or perfection. Faith in Motion is about allowing what we *believe* to shape who we are becoming and how we live in the world God has placed us in.

I believe God has good things ahead for our church and for each of you. The road forward won't always be easy, but it will be meaningful — because we are walking it together, led by a faithful God who always goes before us.

Let's step into this year with hope, courage, and expectation.

Cream of Broccoli Soup

2 cups water
1 16oz package frozen broccoli
1/2 cup chopped onion
1/2 cup margarine
1/2 cup flour
6 cups of milk
4 chicken bouillon cubes
1 tsp white pepper

Boil water in large saucepan; add broccoli. Cover, reduce heat and simmer 5 min. Remove from heat and set aside. Sauté onion in margarine in a Dutch oven over low heat til tender. Add flour, stirring until smooth. Cook for 1 min, stirring constantly. Gradually add milk and bouillon; cook over medium heat, stirring constantly until thickened. Add broccoli, cooking water and pepper. Simmer 20-30 min

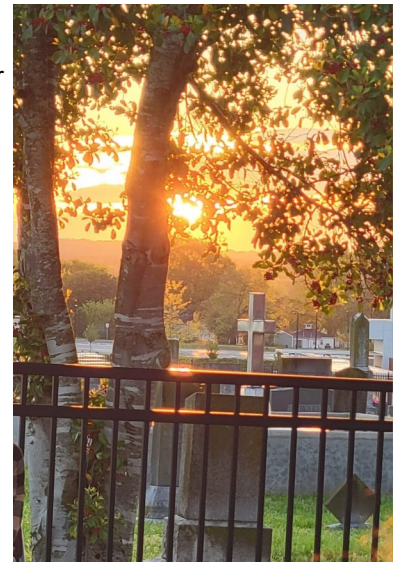
- Thursday, January 8th - Join us for lunch at Captain Steve's in Harrisburg. We will meet at 12:30 pm.

Cemetery Update and Research – Corinne Smith

As we continue researching our church cemetery, maybe you can help....according to our church records and death certificates, the following couple is buried at Fairview Cemetery, the name of our cemetery prior to 1940s/50s. However, no headstones have been found for either of them. Can anyone provide additional information? Could they be buried in Section A-73, near their daughter Sandusky Almond who married Thomas John Garver?

CYRUS M. ALMOND. Born Jun 8, 1843, in Stanly Co., NC, to Allen Allman and Isabelle Hatley. He married Rose Anna McLellan in 1879. They had two children, Sandusky Almond Garver and Addie Almond Isenhour McCollum. Cyrus was a farmer. He enlisted as a Private in the Confederacy, Civil War on May 5, 1861, 14th Regiment, NC Infantry and mustered out on Nov 15, 1862. Cyrus died Dec 27, 1928. His death certificate reflects he was buried at Roberta United Methodist Church, but there is no headstone or church record. ROSE ANNA MCLELLAN ALMOND. Born Apr 20, 1854, in Cabarrus Co., NC, to Dr. Addison Cicero McLellan and Margaret Purviance. She is sometimes referred to as Texana. Rose Anna died Oct 17, 1937.





Faith in Motion: A Faith That Moves Us Forward

“As the body without the spirit is dead, so faith without deeds is dead.” (James 2:26, NIV)

Over the past season, I’ve been praying and asking a simple but important question: **What does it really mean to follow Jesus—not just believe in Him, but live out our faith each day?**

That question has shaped our church’s focus called **Faith in Motion**.

Faith in Motion is not a program or a slogan. It’s a way of describing a living, growing faith. Scripture reminds us that real faith doesn’t stand still. When people encounter God, they move. They take steps—sometimes small, sometimes bold—but always forward. Jesus didn’t invite people to admire Him from a distance. He said, *“Follow Me.”*

Faith in Motion meets you where you are, but it doesn’t leave you there. For some, it’s permission to take the next small step without feeling pressure to have everything figured out. For others, it’s an invitation to trust God more deeply. For all of us, it’s a reminder that faith is about who we are becoming and how we live and love.

To help us live this out together, we use four simple movements known as the **4 Bs**:

Belong – Faith begins with relationship. We were never meant to do faith alone. The church is a place where real people find community, grace, and support.

Believe – Belief is more than information; it’s trust. As we learn who God is through Scripture and prayer, we grow in confidence that His promises are true.

Become – Faith shapes who we are becoming. Following Jesus is a lifelong journey of growth and transformation, not perfection.

Build – Faith overflows into action. We serve, give, and love others as we participate in what God is already doing.

Faith in Motion gives us a shared direction as a church family. My prayer is that it helps each of us take our next faithful step—and discover that God is already walking with us.

And that is a journey worth taking—together.
