Dear Church Family,

February tends to put a big spotlight on love. Hearts, cards, chocolates, and all the reminders that say love is something to be celebrated. And that's a good thing. Love is worth celebrating. But for some folks, this time of year can also stir up quiet feelings of loneliness, loss, or the sense that they've been overlooked.

That's why I'm so grateful that the Bible reminds us that love didn't start with Valentine's Day, it started with God.

Jesus says, *"As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you."* Let that sink in for a moment. The same deep, faithful, never-giving-up love that flows from the Father to the Son is the love Jesus offers to us. Not based on our relationship status. Not based on our best week or our worst one. Just because we belong to Him.

God's love is steady. It doesn't show up only when life is good. It doesn't back away when things get messy. It stays. It holds. It keeps choosing us again and again.

And here's the beautiful part: that kind of love doesn't stop with us. It moves through us.

So, this month, as we celebrate love in all its forms, I hope you'll take a moment to rest in this truth: you are deeply, fully, and forever loved by God. Nothing can take that away. And as you live in that love, may it overflow into the lives of those around you right where you are. Church family, never forget this: God's love for you is real, it is constant, and it is stronger than anything you will ever face. And you are never outside of His care.

Parmesan Oven Fried Chicken

1/2 cup, fine dry bread crumbs
3/4 cup grated Parmesan Cheese
1 tsp oregano
1 tsp garlic powder
1/4 tsp black pepper
6 chicken breast halves
1/2 cup Italian salad dressing

Marinate Chicken breasts in salad dressing, 1/2 hour in refrigerator. Combine remaining ingredients. Remove breasts from marinade and dip in crumb mixture. Spray 13x9 dish with nonstick spray. Place chicken in pan and bake uncovered, approximately 45 min at 350 degrees. Test with fork for doneness. If needed bake a few minutes longer

Our gifts of money, donated items, and volunteer time to these organizations allows us to indirectly reach

Pastor is asking for **25 families** to join a year-long outreach effort. Each participating family will commit to handing out just one invitation card per week for 52 weeks. Rather than distributing everything at once, this will be a steady "drip campaign," allowing us to consistently place invitations into our community throughout the entire year.

The goal is intentional, personal connection. One card each week can be shared with a neighbor, coworker, cashier, friend, or someone God places in your path. As we continue researching our church cemetery, maybe you can help....according to our church records and death certificates, the following individual is reportedly buried at our church cemetery with no marker, according to our church records.

Charles (or Charlie) McDowell Barbee, born July 26, 1891, he was the son of Henry Mack Barbee and Rena Whitley. His siblings are Nealie Elizabeth Barbee who married George Washington Smith, Lonnie Sylvester Barbee who married Martha Shumate, Carrie Mae Barbee who married Albert Wright, Bettie Lou Barbee who married Vance Bradshaw, and Maude Barbee who married 1) William Reynolds and 2) Grover Cook. Charles died Sept 8, 1955. Since our church records reflect he is buried at Roberta Cemetery with no marker, could he be buried in the same plot as his brother, Lonnie Barbee? As you know, the Roberta Church Council voted to invest **\$450,000** in the **ReFresh Project** to update and renew our sanctuary. The **Forward in Faith Team** has been tasked with organizing fundraising efforts to replenish these funds. Below is an update on our progress to date:

Funds Raised

- *Can-In-Each-Hand* (through December 31, 2026): **\$15,328.79**
- *October Giving Tree Fundraiser*: **\$14,880.00**
- *December Bake Sale*: **\$1,575.00**
- *Donations to the Building Fund* (July 28 – December 28): **\$19,271.17**
- Total Raised to Date: \$51,054.96**
- Total Approved by Council: \$450,000.00**
- Remaining Amount to Be Raised: \$398,945.04**

The Forward in Faith Team met on January 13 to plan upcoming fundraising opportunities. Several events are scheduled for Spring 2026, many of which offer wonderful opportunities for fun, fellowship, and participation by all ages. Please mark your calendars and consider how you might be involved:

- **Can-In-Each-Hand** – This ongoing fundraiser continues to collect loose change. If you need a can, please see **Sharon or Dale Wooten**.
- **Nativity Scene Fundraiser** – Debbie Cochran is creating nativity scenes from scrap wood left over from the sanctuary demolition. This is a meaningful way to own a small piece of Roberta's history. These will be available for a **minimum \$15 donation** and will continue until the scrap wood runs out.

- **Hot Dog Sale (April)** – Date to be announced. Volunteers will be needed to help purchase supplies, cook and serve hot dogs, and prepare homemade desserts. More details coming soon.

Bake Sale: Ladies are asked to bring baked goods to the fellowship hall by **9:45 a.m.**
Walk-A-Thon: **"Walking Forward in Faith"** begins at **10:00 a.m.** Six laps around the blacktop parking lot equal one mile; nine laps equal 1.5 miles. Participants may gather sponsors who donate to Roberta Church (*memo: Walk-A-Thon*). This event is open to everyone—children, youth, and adults alike. You can walk, sponsor a walker, bake, or purchase baked goods.

Any baked goods not sold on Saturday will be available for purchase in the Welcome Center following worship on **Sunday, May 17**.

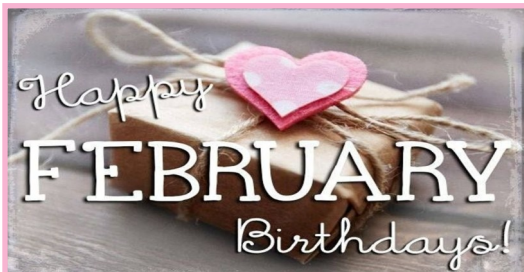
